Before School – Students / uniform / equipment


- Arrive on time for school Be at your entrance and line up from 8.15 8.20.

Attendance and Punctuality


- Being at school and on time each day directly impacts your outcomes at GCSE. Even a few days off or being 5 or 10 minutes late regularly can have a negative effect on your results.

Whole School Detentions

Follow The MA Way

- A C2 consequence is evidenced on Arbor by the teacher/other adult. SLT Quality of Education / Curriculum Areas Leader, teachers and Learning Support Assistants run the WSD Monday – Friday. C2 detentions are 30 minutes but if a student fails their detention or has a C2 buddy out twice in one day, the student will complete a 60 minutes detention.
- Students also have a WSD for late to School– The SLT Personal Development / Director of Culture and Character and Leaders of Climate and Behaviour run this detention Monday – Friday. All detentions are during the lunchtime. A student is placed in the detention if they are late to form time lesson at 8:30.

What to remember



Uniform

- Outdoor coats Outdoor coats are NOT to be worn in the building. Please take your coat off when entering any entrance in school – Before school/ break time / lunchtime. Please do not wear a hoodie to school. If you are cold – wear an outdoor coat to school
- Outdoor coats must not be worn in lessons.
- Scarves Large outdoor scarves have the same rule as coats.
- Blazer Your blazer should be worn at all times No student should be wearing a blazer in the old royal blue colour.
- Ties Please make sure you wear your tie everyday. Ties should be clipped to your shirt collar. Every student was given a free tie at the start of the academic year. Year 11 – a gold stripe on your tie. Shoes – Sensible, outdoor, black shoes should be worn for school. Please do not wear trainers to school. Trainers are for PE lessons only. They are NOT to be worn at break or lunchtime.

- Trousers Black trousers should be worn NOT grey
- Skirts Black skirts should be worn and be of a modest length (Knee length).
- Jewellery Studded earrings or small hoops to be worn only. No other item of jewellery should be worn except for a watch.
- Makeup Students should not wear makeup of any kind.
- No extremes hair cuts or brightly coloured hair.
- Failure to adhere to uniform expectations will result in withdrawal from Pledge Trips and other privileges.



Students / Uniform


- Expect to be picked up by your Year Director, Leader of Climate and Behaviour or SLT if you are not in the correct uniform.
- Do you have a genuine reason for not having the correct uniform?
- You must have a note explaining this from home which will then be signed/ dated by the DCC/ LCB or SLT member of staff in your year group.
- If you do not have a note from home but have a genuine reason, then your DCC / LCB / SLT will write one. Staff will question why you are not in the correct uniform.
- A note helps to resolve matters instantly, but uniform MUST be resolved at the first appropriate opportunity – your next weekend in the school term – ready for the following week.
- If you do not have appropriate footwear, you will be directed to swap it for school-owned shoes for the duration of the school day.

- The Year Director & Leader of Climate and Behaviour are aware of students who were given item(s) of uniform by Manchester Academy during the Autumn term 2023.
- Parents have been contacted and it is essential students wear their uniform item(s) which the school has provided from them. This could be a blazer / tie and/or black shoes.
- All students should wear their uniform with pride.



Student / Uniform - consequence

- Your uniform will be checked on the gate / in your form room and in your lessons Pd. 1-5.
- Not complying in wearing an item(s) of school uniform will means information will be logged on Arbor for teachers/ parents/ students to access instantly.
- The DCC and LCB will check Arbor daily and will contact home by phone. An email home may also be sent.
- The messaging app (MyEd) will also be used to contact parents.

- All staff in the academy can log on to Arbor – staff will provide information in the notes section.
- Form time Uniform checks are part of form time – again information will be added to Arbor.
- Pd. 1 5 teachers will repeat this process of Arbor.



Corridors – Students

- It is important that you know your timetable and the timing of the school day. If uncertain, please check your year group noticeboard on the ground floor – canteen area.
- Students must always walk on the left for health and safety.
- MA5 Move quietly and calmly around the Academy
- When moving, do not raise your voice above speaking volume.
- At all times follow staff instructions such as the 'Hands Off' rule.

Eating Areas – Students

- You must keep to your designated area – For Year 10 this is the canteen/field and Astro.
- Students can only eat in the Canteenwhere hot and cold food is available at break and Lunchtime 2.
- Please make sure you place all rubbish in the bins provided.
- Staff are on duty should you require any help.

STUDENTS FOLLOW STAFF INSTRUCTIONS

- You must not be late to the lesson. Punctuality is important as 'Do Now' tasks are given out at the start of each lesson.

- Make sure you sit where you have been asked to sit. Your teacher will have a seating plan for you to follow.

- You should always be always a role model for other students in the lesson and around school – be friendly, and treat everyone with kindness, respect and tolerance.

- Keep focused on the I do/ we do / you do tasks – make sure that you complete all 'you do' work set by your teacher.

-The bell is for your teacher – your teacher will dismiss you sensibly at the end of the lesson.

- For well-being, you should engage in a range of Academy enrichment opportunities which your subject / year group teachers offer. Look out for the MA Pledges!

- A smile, please and thank you is important when speaking to staff or students.

STUDENTS FOLLOW OUR 'HANDS OFF' CULTURE TO ENSURE SAFETY AND WELL BEING

MA4 – Hands off

- It is important students feel safe in Manchester Academy. The 'Hands off' rule must be followed by all students to ensure everyone is safe and secure in their daily business.

- Staff and students may ask you to follow the 'Hands Off' rule, this could mean the 'Hands off' phrase is used when a student is 'hugging' 'touching' 'holding' 'pushing' another student for example.

-Please keep your hands to yourself for health, safety and well-being. Do not invade another student's personal space.

- 'If you do not comply to the Hands Off' at breaks and/or lunches – you will be asked to stand around the edge of you indoor/ outdoor space. Any Year 8 student not following the 'Hands Off' will stand with a member of staff at the edge of the designated area with the member of staff on duty.

- All 'Hands off' breaches will be logged and will be dealt with immediately.

Expectations of students in the classroom

- Students arrive on time to lesson and enter classroom silently.
- Students begin assigned starter task without fuss.
- Students participate fully in lesson.
- Student are polite to other classmates and class teacher.

Consequences of not meeting classroom expectations.

1. If you fail to meet above expectations, the teacher will issue you with a **<u>choice.</u>**

a. If issued with this, this is your chance to change your behaviour and get back on track.

2. If you persist in failing to meet expectation after being issued a choice, you will be given a **<u>consequence</u>** and be exited to another classroom. This is a 'buddy out'.

Student Expectations – Buddy Outs

- Buddy Out in lessons occur when you receive
- a C2 / Consequence 2.

- You will be sent to another classroom on your corridor. This might be a Curriculum Area Leader, an experienced teacher in or out of the department your lesson is in.

- Your teacher will send you with work to complete in your lesson.

- If you fail to comply or disrupt the lesson you will be picked up by on-call staff – SLT/ DCC / CAL and taken to the Respect Room.

- All 'Buddy Outs' are recorded on Arbor by your teachers and monitored by your Year Team – Director of Culture and Character and Behaviour Team Leader.

- Some student's may be put on a Form Tutor/ Pastoral / or SLT report depending on the individual students' Arbor record
