

Key Stage 4 Big Picture – Photography 2025-27

Whole Course Overview

Photography is an inspiring and creative subject in which students will develop a range of technical skills that will allow them to express their ideas and intentions through the art of the photographic image. As each student progresses through the course, they will develop their abilities in using a variety of different digital and analogue cameras, equipment, and processes. These skills will empower students to produce beautiful and original photographic outcomes. Students are encouraged to explore the history of photography and analyse how the photographic image has featured and impacted social and cultural issues since its invention. Manchester's rich cultural and industrial heritage has long been a source of inspiration for photographers, and this ever-changing environment provides a unique backdrop for our students to explore the subject. They will investigate and evaluate the work of notable photographers, both past and present, to draw inspiration to influence their personal creative responses. Alongside this they will develop transferable skills in communication, collaboration and independence, all with the aim of preparing them to confidently apply their photographic skills and knowledge in future studies and employment as they enter the modern world.

Technical Skills

Students will become proficient in using a range of digital and analogue cameras and equipment. They will learn photographic techniques including studio set-up, photo shoot planning, lighting, viewpoint, aperture, shutter speed, depth of field, movement, digital editing and manipulation, film, use of enlarger, chemical processes, photographic paper and darkroom practices. Students will develop these skills while working in photographic genres that include studio, portraiture, location, landscape, nature, documentary, photojournalism, fashion, experimental and art photography. Students will learn how to consider colour, line, form, tone, texture, shape, pattern, composition, scale, sequence and contrast in their work.

Component 1 - Portfolio

Students will build a portfolio of work documenting photographic practices, analysis, evaluations and experimentation leading to creative responses. The portfolio will consist of several small projects and one large scale sustained project running through Year 10 and 11.

Component 2 – Externally Set Assignment

Students will choose from seven themed starting points to build an independent body of work. Through experimentation, investigation, manipulation and the influence of the work of others, students will produce a further portfolio and self-directed creative outcomes to be exhibited and assessed.

Assessment – Holistic

AO1: Develop ideas through investigations, demonstrating critical understanding of sources.

AO2: Refine work by exploring ideas, selecting and experimenting with appropriate media, materials, techniques and processes.

AO3: Record ideas, observations and insights relevant to intentions as work progresses.

AO4: Present a personal and meaningful response that realises intentions and demonstrates understanding of visual language.
